Executive Director's Report

System Updates & Industrial Sales Report

Wirtz gave a system update. Wirtz reported on the industrial sales; April industrial sales were \$2,048,028.00.

ND Industrial Commission

Wirtz presented the board with the need to put surveillance cameras at the depots. There have been a few oil spills that WAWS has not been able to determine the responsible parties, therefore WAWS has the expense of the cleanup. The approximate cost for 3 or 4 cameras at each site would be \$30,000.00 for all depots. **Rust moved to approve the purchase of the surveillance cameras pending reimbursement approval from NDIC industrial sales, Haake seconded.**

Williams Rural Water

Chairman Mark Owan let the board know that WRWD believes they have infringement on their franchise protection within their district and that they will be pursuing the matter.

R & T Water Supply Commerce

The City of Ray will sell their old landfill to R & T Water Supply Commerce for the cost of engineering, which is approximately \$130,000.00.

Liesener made a motion to pay the city of Ray \$130,000.00 for the transfer of title from the City of Ray to R & T Water Supply Commerce and the removal cost of an old fence and installation of a new fence, dependent on all approval processes and the ND Health department approval, Rust seconded.

WAWSA By-law Changes

The board was presented with the seconded reading of the proposed WAWSA By-law changes that will revise the first determination date for recalculating the members weighted voting since many members had not experienced three full years of water sales yet. The revisions also change the special meeting notice provision from 3 days to 6 days to be consistent with the legislation. **Haake moved to approve the WAWSA by-law changes, Brandt seconded.**

Resolution of Condemnation

Wirtz ask for a group resolution of condemnation for the following projects: WRWD/R&T Epping Distribution, WRWD Blacktail Dam, BDW Projects, MCWRD Tobacco Gardens, R & T North Tioga Rural Distribution and R& T Stanley Distribution. There has been significant negotiation of easements on most of these projects throughout the winter, so Wirtz recommended a motion for condemnation on all parcels without voluntarily signed easements to date. This motion would request WAWS legal counsel to contact landowners and begin the condemnation process if legal counsel did not obtain signatures voluntarily. All easements should be taken with the same payment parameters approved in other matters. Zubke moved to approve the resolution of condemnation for the listed projects, Rust seconded.

Vehicle Purchase

Wirtz asked for the board approval to trade-in a 3/4 ton pickup for a 1 ton dually with a flatbed. **Zubke moved to approve the trade-in and cost difference, Haake seconded.**

State Water Commission

Wirtz will be attending a meeting with SWC staff on June 1st to discuss the loan repayment, using industrial and/or domestic dollars.

The board was given a proposed 2015-2017 Biennium Prioritized Capital Improvement plan illustrating the \$30M and \$60M funding projects to be completed. The board discussed the projects and concerns they may have with the prioritized list. Rust made a motion to approve the proposed 2015-2017 Project Prioritization with the understanding future adjustments may be needed, Haake seconded.
